



## DAY 03Let us not be afraid


Today, here is a key verse to not only read but to memorize as you meditate on this devotional during the week of prayer: "God did not give us (me) a spirit of timidity (or fear), but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord..." (2 Timothy 1:7, 8a).

Today, welcome to the battlefield of fear and faith! Even though Peter, the disciple of Jesus, denied Jesus 3 times, Jesus' love and grace empowered Peter to become a powerful instrument in God's hands "to testify about our Lord". Even though you may feel afraid, or you might compare yourself to someone else and come up short, it is so important to know that God's love and grace will strengthen you just like He did for Peter. Under the influence of fear, it loudly says, "You can't do it!" as it makes you feel small, insignificant and powerless.

But under the influence of faith, God says, "With Me, all things are possible because you are on a divine appointment for Me and with Me as you share your faith & story with the person that the Holy Spirit has brought across your path today".

As these two forces of fear and faith are at war with each other, remember the great news that Jesus has already overcome your enemy of fear which enables you to be victorious also with His spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline.

Be fully aware that a testimony is waiting for you on the other side of fear because you faced this great test on this battlefield and you won because of Jesus! So, share empowered by the Holy Spirit even if you feel afraid.




## DAY 04Let us have the words

The Bible calls us to be ready to share the gospel at all times, in all circumstances, and with people from all different walks of life and backgrounds. That's a lot of unique situations, people, and personal experiences to relate to! Using one approach for every person and situation may not be an effective use of our words. The message of the gospel never changes, but sometimes our delivery needs to. Just as Paul says in 1 Corinthians 9:22-23: "To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some [...]."

The good news is that we don't need to come up with the right words on our own. Its through the power of God and through the guidance of the Holy Spirit that we are given the words needed. Jesus gives His followers this encouragement: "[...] do not worry about how you will defend yourselves or what you will say, for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that time what you should say" (Luke 12:11-12).

The Bible also gives us some sound wisdom on using our words to share the gospel with others: "Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone" (Colossians 4:5-6). Read also 2 Timothy 4:2.


The way we deliver messages matters. Our attitude should reflect the patience that Jesus Christ extends to each one of us. Its not about trying to win an argument or prove someone wrong. We are called to be wise in the way we interact with those who don't know Christ. Our words should always be gracious, showing love and respect towards others - like Jesus. Let's pray together for wisdom and guidance from the Holy Spirit as we use our words to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.



## DAY 05 Let them hear

One summer, while counseling at Camp Mishewah, I counseled a young boy who had hearing difficulties and could only hear with hearing aids. During one of our waterfront sessions, we were assigned to go sailing. This young boy would not be able to wear his hearing aids due to the water, so we would have to be able to communicate with our hands. As we began our trip out onto the windy lake, I realized that he was seated in a way that his back was to me and he was facing out enjoying the view of the lake. It didn't matter how loud I yelled to warn him of the incoming sail, he could not hear me. Thankfully, there were no injuries and he really seemed to enjoy himself, while I nearly had a heart attack. You see, it didn't matter that the warning signs were being belted out from behind. Because he could not hear it, it meant nothing to him.

This memory reminds me of the verse Romans 10:14. "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" We look at the world around us and ask why don't they believe in Jesus and why don't they follow Him?" Have we ever then asked ourselves if anyone has ever told them about Jesus or have they ever heard the Good News? If no one has shared the Gospel with them, then they will never hear it and they will never believe in Him. Now like my story above, I could have yelled all day at that camper, and since he would never have heard me, he would still have been hit with the sail. In order to reach people for Christ, we have a mandate to share the Good News with them. We need to take the time to get to know them, to develop a relationship with them, so that they can hear the Good News and believe! 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How do you feel about being in control? If you're anything like me you prefer it. You prefer sitting in the driver's seat, or picking the restaurant you go to for dinner. It's not because you love being controlling, it's because you don't love the feeling of helplessness. Which is why today's prayer point can feel so frustrating.

Today we are praying that those we are ministering to will respond to the Good News of the Gospel. That in the words of Paul, they would declare with their mouths that "Jesus is Lord," and believe in their heart that God raised him from the dead, so that they will be saved (Romans 10:9).


This response is not within our control. We could answer all of their questions, spend hours talking about Jesus together, or offer countless bible studies. At the end of the day, the decision to follow Jesus is their own.

What we can do is step out in obedience to share and hand the rest over to God in prayer. Here are 4 reminders for us as we pray today:

- 1.Be Confident: God longs to hear and respond to our prayers, so we can begin praying with confidence, knowing our prayers are important to God.
- 2.Be Specific: What is it that you want God to do in the situation, or for the person? An example might be: *"Help \_\_\_\_\_\_ respond to your love."*
- 3. Be Expectant: God loves our friends, family and community more than we do, so be expectant!
- 4.Be Persistent: Sometimes we need to ask and keep asking. (Matthew 7:7)
